I don't even know where to start with my feelings. I guess the place to start is just GRATITUDE. Last year, we made the decision to change schools for our son beginning the 2022/2023 school year. It was hard. There were teachers we LOVED at his old school, and it's all we had ever known, but it just wasn't a match for our child. The school we picked this year wasn't where I thought I wanted Matt to go, initially. He was accepted at other private schools, and, initially, I tried to control the situation with what I thought was right for his learning style. But, something happened along the way, and God literally spoke to me and said, "Nope. You're gonna let ME direct traffic for once." I turned it over to Him. What I had done wasn't working for our family, and, guess what? God showed off.

I met Dr. Minta Hardman and instantly felt connected and peaceful. She said, "We want him here."

We want him here...Powerful words for a mama who wasn't sure if her different learner was wanted in other classrooms...We want him here.

We took a leap of faith, literally. Sign him up!

Then, I met Mrs. Sarah Wasanyi and Mrs.Cinthy Harner. Mrs. Harner did his testing prior to starting the year. Mrs. Wasanyi would be his 3rd grade teacher for core subjects.

"We want him here." It echoed. "There is a difference here. It's the MVCA difference." "You'll see."

Then, I met Miss Pam Neff who made my son a special cup for his milk and Ms. Christy Sellers who air fried his fish sticks, and Mrs. Luci Walker who had nothing but positive and encouraging words. I found out Ms. Kim Walker would be his art teacher, and she quickly met my son where he was and supported him (he is not an art fan!). I met Miss Tammi Cooke who would be his "Labrary" (Library and Computer) teacher, and I was nervous because he had almost no desk top computer skills. She said, "It's OK. We've got this." We met Coach Gibby at basketball camp and he and my son worked through challenges and formed a special relationship. Mrs. Rachael Mengel worked hard all year to keep me in line and he trusted her to care for him when he needed to call Mama or be picked up early. Mr. Thomas Sederstrom greeted him every single day at drop-off (even if we surpassed the 1-hr parking limit ). Miss Maddi Sulser and Mrs. Tracy Hogbin also loved my son and he loved them.

Off he went...a 3rd grader at Mountain View Christian Academy.....and, oh, did he soar!!!

My son has never had any grade less than an A at the end of any school year since Kindergarten in his previous schools. He has also never gotten a classroom or other award for his academic or other efforts. He has been crushed each year when he didn't receive an award or even acknowledgement. He felt...overlooked.

This year, he wasn't overlooked. He was honored. He worked so hard, and each time his name was called in the awards ceremony, he literally couldn't believe it. He said, "How am I getting these awards?" His teacher, sitting in front of us who overheard him said, "We see you. We know how hard you are working."

"We see you.".... "We want you.".... "There is a difference here."....."You'll see."
They see him!

They want him!

There is a difference!

I see now!

Thank you, Mountain View Christian Academy for changing our lives. I can't wait to see whose lives change next year.

#### A SCHOOLWIDE CULTURE OF CONTINUOUS GROWTH

This year's annual theme was **Moving Forward** and to be completely transparent, moving forward sometimes feels like 3 steps forward, then 2 steps back, doesn't it? **But that still has us forward one step!** There is no doubt that God is on the move in our school, our culture, our world, our families, our churches, even though at times it doesn't seem like we are moving as quickly as we would like.

At MVCA, we have worked hard to maintain a culture of continuous growth. As a teenager, I remember being challenged by the quote "Even if you are on the right track, you can still get run over if you just stand still." We have to keep growing and changing.

Each year, part of our debriefing process at the end of the school year is to do a SWOT analysis and seek input from our students, our parents, and our staff. We then compile our top 3 (this year we will give a few extras that were right up at the top). From all of the suggestions we then create "to do" lists and action plans for continuous growth. It was interesting to see what emerged in all 3 group's surveys as our greatest strengths and greatest challenges.

#### 2022-23 Greatest Strengths

- 1. The Relationships that Form and Exist at MVCA In some way, shape, or form, this rises to the top each year. The positive relationships between staff to staff, staff to students, staff to parents, parents to parents, and students to students are very much a part of the MVCA DIFFERENCE and were noted again this year as one of our greatest strengths. "As iron sharpens iron, one man sharpens another." (Prov 27:17) We are better people because of the MVCA Community. Thank you!
- 2. **The Flexibility and Willingness of ALL staff and administration to Serve where needed** I say it all the time because it is true "We have the best staff this side of heaven!" This team laughs together, cries together, challenges each other, and is always willing to help cover any holes or gaps. Shout out to the MVCA faculty and admin team!
- 3. **The Number and Variety of Clubs, Sports, and Activities for our Students** This made me so happy to see this emerge as a top strength! Although we are small, there are so many ways for our students to "plug in" and connect. The elementary Friday afternoon clubs were a hit, our sports programs, the PTF and SGO events, the trips and retreats, the Fine and Performing Arts electives were all ways that our students were able to get involved and grow.
- 4. **A few Honorable Mentions** The noticeable changes in our **schoolwide security** with the new buzzers and cameras and unified SRP and the positive change with our **new cleaners** were also mentioned by students, parents, and staff!

#### 2022-23 Greatest Challenges

- 1. Consistency among the Staff with handling Discipline/Classroom Management, especially in the areas of Cell Phones and Dress Code We will be looking at this thoroughly this summer and creating, revising, and implementing some new policies in the fall to ensure that we uphold the standards that we put in place.
- 2. Ensuring that we have the Staff and Programs in place to meet the growing Special Needs and Educational Gaps of some or our Students This is very important to us as we grow. We are so blessed with Ms. Harner and the Learning Center teacher aides, and we want to make sure that we are able to accommodate our students' ISP's and 504 plans accurately. Pray for us as we evaluate how to tackle this challenge.
- 3. **All things Lunch** The challenge of sharing the gym as a cafeteria and shuffling K-12 grade through lunches, recess, study halls, working lunches, elective classes and more in a timely, effective, and organized manner is another area that we will be evaluating.
- 4. How to Live with a Christ-centered Worldview in a Culture that is rapidly moving away from Biblical principles is another challenge that we have been researching and praying for God's guidance in for several years. We trust that He is on the throne and has always been throughout the ages and the waves of change and we will seek Him to stay true to our philosophy, mission statement, core values and statement of faith and to create policies and procedures that will empower our staff and students to stand on God's truths.

Our world is changing rapidly, but praise God we serve the One who is the same yesterday, today, and forever, yet His mercies are new every morning. Thank you sharing your feedback! Thank you for moving forward with us! We covet your prayers as we address these issues and more.

#### LESSONS LEARNED FROM SOME OF OUR 2023 GRADUATES (submitted by Trudy Keiter)

In Senior Thesis class, I asked our students to reflect upon the 3 greatest lessons they have learned throughout **high school**, not academic lessons, but life lessons. As I read their papers and heard their final presentations at year's end, I recognized some distinct themes that permeated each of their writings and speeches.

Ella Drury's theme was love—first love for herself and then love for others. She wrote, "I decided ... to devote some time to bettering myself and to taking care of myself in the best way that I could mentally, physically, and spiritually. ... My spiritual health was ... the most important element of that, because my mental health improved so much." Part of that self-care includes "making sure the people you keep around are worthy of your efforts and that they are not negative influences in your life." She added, "I want to be defined by the things I love. I don't want to be held back by the old wounds that haunt me." And as she spoke in her oral presentation, her newfound confidence led her to say, "I have learned how to take care of myself and to know who I am in God's eyes—I am fearfully and wonderfully made." What a tremendous lesson to learn before embarking into her present world that wants people to question at every turn who they are and why they are here!

**Gratitude** was *Eli Shettel's* theme. He wrote, "Sometimes we need to go through the hardest times to get back to the happy ones. Sometimes we need to have nothing to truly appreciate having something. Sometimes we need to give rather than focusing on what we can receive."

First, he thanked **God**. "God deserves all the glory. He has blessed me with so many different good times, opportunities, and talents in life that I would not be where I am today if it were not for Him. In the end, God is all that matters, and we should appreciate what he has done for us/what we have."

He thanked his **teachers**. "I would not be who I am today if it weren't for the Christlike attitudes and actions of all involved there (MVCA). My teachers have become **mentors** for me, and some of them have become **great friends** that I can trust... I would not be the Christian I am today if not for the selfless effort of the MVCA staff and faculty."

In his oral presentation, he thanked his **parents**. "Mom, "without you, I don't know who I'd be." "Dad, I am lucky to have been blessed to have you as my dad and friend, and you are one of my favorite people."

Eli has given himself a wonderful gift -learning how to be grateful for everything God has given. This mindset is a sharp contrast to the entitled attitude of many young people today!

Do what you love was the theme that *Blake Grey* highlighted in his written and oral presentations. Blake finds satisfaction in so many areas that he is finding it difficult to choose just one. He referenced Ecc. 3:12-13 that says, "That each of them may...find satisfaction in all their toil—this is the gift of God." He continued, "We should all do what we love and do it for God so we can use the life he gave us to the fullest and leave with no regrets." In his speech, Blake said, "I want to do it all. I want to be somebody my kids, my parents, my friends can say, 'He was one of a kind.'" It's so good to know that our students leave us embracing that fact—that each of them is uniquely gifted for a purpose in this world.

Cole Gheen's writing and his speech centered on work. He wrote, "I value work because my family is very proud of our work ethic." And what a work ethic he has! He left school daily to go to work and worked every weekend, too. He is a great asset to his family business. He added, "Managing my time will be less stressful after high school because I'll have more time to work with." In his final oral presentation, he expressed his gratitude to his parents for the work ethic they instilled in him. "I want to thank my dad and mom for pushing me when I didn't want to be pushed. I do more adulting than most normal 17-year-olds." That is so true for this hard-working and enterprising young man.

Each year, the seniors must think long and hard to write about difficult topics such as who they are, what they have learned, who they want to be, who they want to marry, and what they want to do. Those thought processes lead to some great acknowledgements, some great plans, and some great conclusions like the ones above. What a joy it is as educators to be able to listen to their words of wisdom, their words of appreciation, and their excitement for the future as they leave our halls for the last time ready to **love themselves and others**, ready to **give thanks**, ready to **do what they love**, and ready to **work hard!** Thank you to the class of 2023!
