Resources & Textbooks

Physical Education

Quarter One:

In this quarter, we will have lessons that will help the children to learn that God wants his people to be free. We will study about covenants, people in Egypt, what a leader is, and Moses. When we follow the orders God gives us and follow His directions, He takes care of us.

Quarter Two:

We will discuss rules that God gave to us to live by so we would not become slaves to sin. When we break His rules, we do things that hurt ourselves and those we love. When we obey God, we are "set apart" and others can see that we love Him.

Quarter Three:

We will learn about the great commandment Jesus gave that sums up the Ten Commandments. When we obey Jesus, we are free to enjoy our lives. We find our **freedom in obeying God.** over them.

Quarter Four:

Ears serve when they listen. As the children focus on the importance of listening before acting, they will be encouraged to obey all who have been placed in authority over them.



Language Arts fosters an appreciation of language as a gift from God in second-grade. Develops the correct use of English grammar in written and oral communication. Uses the Writing Process to teach different types of compositions. Encourages clear and effective writing. Develops study and reference skills. Improves listening and speaking skills that at times second-graders need. Lastly, Language Arts encourages enjoyment through chapter themes and connections to other subject areas.

Library

In Library, the main focus is to continue to develop and highlight a love of reading. Students listen to a variety of books of various genres, including fiction and nonfiction. The media specialist encourages the children to choose books for pleasure reading that appeal to each child's interests. Students may check out one book per week and learn how to care for the book correctly.

Mathematics

"How priceless is Your unfailing love, O God! People take refuge in the shadow of Your wings." Psalm 36:7 In second grade, we will stretch their knowledge of math in many areas. First, we will learn about classifying, bar graphs, even numbers, odd numbers, and place values. As they master this information we will then move into geometry such as line segments, angles, and parallelograms.

Secondly, we will learn the concept of multiplication and the importance of memorization. We will learn 0 to 6 in second-grade.

While we are learning new concepts we will also be reviewing concepts that they learned in first

grade such as telling time, counting money, addition, and subtraction.

Lastly, we will learn two and three digit addition and subtraction with division. Fractions will be introduced at the end of the year to prepare them for third grade.

Computer

Students will learn how to log in, use the mouse, proper terminology for computer parts and actions, have an overview of finger placement for typing, digital citizenship and what not to do on the computer, etc

Science

God's world is full of amazing things. They are all round us. We will be studying Science to learn about God's world. We will learn foundational science facts and skills for furthering our learning. We will promote discipline and order to approach problem solving. In Science, we will have positive attitudes during active participation and relevant discussions.



Social Studies

Studying Heritage Studies 2 will help the student understand who he is as an American. Many Americans possess very little knowledge of their past. As we go through Heritage Studies we will pay special attention to how we should value our freedom. Some of the chapters that we will discuss include : God so Loved the World, Community Life, Liberty and Justice for all, Exploring our Past, Thirteen Colonies, and many more things.
